Emphasis was placed on applying appropriate formulas and reasoning through multi-step problems.

Logic and Proof

Students were assessed on their ability to construct logical arguments and formal geometric proofs. This included writing two-column proofs and paragraph proofs using deductive reasoning and previously established theorems.

Exam Format and Question Types

Sample Problem 4: Circle Theorems

In a circle, an inscribed angle intercepts an arc measuring 80 degrees. Find the measure of the inscribed angle.

Solution: The measure of an inscribed angle is half the measure of its intercepted arc. Therefore, the angle measures $\frac{80}{2} = 40$ degrees.
